ACTIONS TAKEN IN THE PRECEDING 18 MONTHS TO INCREASE SAFETY

The following information is applicable to the San Marcos campus unless otherwise noted

1. Retrofitted the lighting at Markstein Hall exterior stairwells.
2. Increased security services at CSUSM Temecula to match hours of operation.
3. The UPD dispatch center enabled Text to 911. This service is available to anyone in or around Campus. Calling 911 remains the fastest way to reach police and fire rescue. However, if you can't make a call, you can text 911 to reach police or fire rescue service. Text to 911 is also available at CSUSM Temecula and MSJC TVC.
4. UPD added an explosive detection dog to the University Police K9 Program.
5. Housing evacuation drills were completed each semester, a campus-wide lockdown drill fall semester, and a campus-wide evacuation drill spring semester.
6. Completed and continue to offer emergency management trainings covering disaster and active shooter response for new employees, including student assistants.
7. Expansion of the Naloxone administration program (Narcan) to include housing staff for opioid overdose reversal.

CHANGES IN SAFETY PRECAUTIONS EXPECTED TO BE MADE DURING THE NEXT 24 MONTHS

The following information is applicable to the San Marcos campus unless otherwise noted

1. Upgrade campuswide key system and functionality reporting. Subsequent re-key of campus buildings and structures.
2. UPD is launching an online access to data for crimes and incidents reported to UPD.
3. UPD is partnering with local community colleges, Mira Costa College and Palomar College, to provide Rape Aggression Defense (R.A.D.) courses for students, faculty, and staff.
4. Install DSX card access at the Viasat Engineering Pavilion and Academic Hall allowing the buildings to be locked down and the monitoring of who enters the buildings and rooms.
5. Reorganize the emergency operations center (EOC) staff through recruitment and training.
6. Revitalization of the Building Marshal program through training, drills, and supplemental curriculum.
7. Modify the naloxone administration program (Narcan)
